PENTECOST SUNDAY

Tena koutou katoa,

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Descent of the Holy Spirit. In the first reading today, when the disciples gathered on the day of the Pentecost, they suddenly heard what sounded like a powerful wind from Heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house. Then something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire, then separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were filled with the Holy Spirit.

This occurred on the day of the Pentecost. What then was Pentecost before we knew it as the day when the Holy Spirit descended upon the disciples and Mary? To understand this, we must see it against the Feast of Weeks (Shavuot) background, one of the three Biblical pilgrimage festivals. The festival marks the completion of the seven-week counting period between Passover and Shavuot.

Shavuot was originally a harvest festival, the second of two first-fruits occasions — the wheat harvest. This holiday was more than just the bringing of the first of the crops to present before God—it was a time to remember how Israel arrived in the land, recounting the journey of faith of the entire nation.

Shavuot also commemorates the giving of the Torah to Moses. Why? The Israelites came to the foot of Mount Sinai "in the third month", the month of Sivan. Since this was also the month of Shavuot, the rabbis deduced that God gave the Torah on Shavuot. The most important event in Jewish history – receiving the Torah at Mount Sinai – happened on Shavuot.

Now we can see these beautiful parallels between giving His Law and giving His Spirit. On both occasions, the Pentecost becomes the day when Heaven is opened and God Himself claims His people. Hence, this was not just a coincidence.

God was re-creating the events of Mount Sinai in a new way. In the Jewish Shavuot, the Law was given as a sign of the new covenant with his chosen people. In the new Pentecost, the Holy Spirit descended as a sign of our new covenant with God.

PARISH POLICE VETTING PROCESS

The spirituality in carrying out ministries in the church is to ensure that the dignity (personhood) of the recipients of the ministry is uphold and protected. The parish is now in the position to police vet volunteers involved in ministries dealing with vulnerable adults, youth, and children. This means the Extraordinary Ministers for Holy Communion to the sick and housebound, Visitation Ministers, Youth ministers, Ministers for the Children's Liturgy, Sacramental Program Leaders, and Altar Server's Trainers are required to come for the police vetting. I believe the Son ascended into heaven. In our discussion on the resurrection, we spoke about the transformation of Jesus' body when He rose from the dead. Think of how Jesus acted during those forty

days after the resurrection. He could come through locked doors, appear and disappear at will – things we modern humans are likely to associate with science fiction.

The Scriptures are very brief in their descriptions of Jesus' ascension. Only Mark and Luke mention it specifically at all, and then it is confined to a couple of sentences. Interestingly, both evangelists describe Jesus as "going up" to heaven – which raises the question, again, of

where heaven might be.

But this should not be our focus in considering the ascension. What is really relevant in this article of the Creed is that Jesus' human body, changed and glorified at His resurrection, is now totally absorbed into the omnipotent energy which is God. How? Only God knows. It is a truth too vast for our weak human understanding. But it is truth nevertheless and the basis of our belief that Jesus is God. Greater minds than ours have tried to explain this mystery. We are asked simply to believe.
