SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT — DAY OF PRAYER FOR CHILDREN

Today is the Day of Prayer for Children. A passage in psalm says, "Behold, children are a heritage from the LORD, the fruit of the womb a reward" (Psalm 127:3). The word "heritage" means "inheritance." Of course, today, whenever we think of the inheritance people receive, we think of money and property. However, in the Bible, children are God's extraordinary riches given to us. Fundamentally, this is why great offsprings were a critical part of God's promise when God made a covenant with Abraham, "I will make you into a great nation, and I will bless you . . . and all peoples on earth will be blessed through you" (Genesis 12:2–3).

On the other hand, infertility should never be considered a sign of God's punishment or less important to God. Just like the argument of the apostle Paul for single people in 1 Corinthians 7:32-33, parents without children can see it as an advantage because they can devote more time to serving God.

But how do they be a blessing? The next verse from the quote above says, "Like arrows in the hand of a warrior are the children of one's youth" (Psalm 127:4). Arrow was a common weapon for battles or wars in the Bible. Hence, God has designed the children to be like warriors providing protection or safety for their parents. This is, perhaps, especially in old age when parents can no longer effectively "defend" themselves.

Having this said, all parents must recognize that no one becomes a warrior without adequate training. Hence, households are places of "training for good warriors." The over-arching element in training is love.

It is innate for parents to love their children. It is an instinct, like a recessive DNA turned on upon a child's conception, to embark on a whole new level - a journey of loving through caring, rearing, and training. In the same way, this journey profoundly reconfigures the parents' whole being.

However, many parents struggle to do so. As a result, some children suffer from violence and a lack of compassion and love. The number of government agencies, NGOs, and initiatives reflects the dire need to avert this situation.

There is another kind of violence and lack of love that children are predisposed to, especially when they are unborn. Abortion. They are treated as of less value when they have not traversed the boundary of the womb. Why so? The church always upholds that life begins at conception, not at birth.

Hence, on this Day of Prayer for Children, let us celebrate the precious gifts God has given us - our children. Let us remind ourselves that our noble duty is to uphold their dignity and worth by providing a loving environment. Likewise, the church's sacred duty is to promote their welfare, born and unborn.
