A StVdeP member has visited the Teen Parent Unit to distribute some items to the young mothers there and she will have an ongoing contact with the Unit. A large container of clothes and blankets has been taken to Taitoko Kindy, another relationship we see as ongoing.

### Meet our Mayor, Bernie Wanden



Bernie has been part of the Levin scene permanently since 1984, although being connected to it through his marriage to Sharon in 1979. His in-laws owned McLeod's Book Centre and were looking to retire, so offered the couple a partnership in the

business, a decision Bernie has never regretted.

At that time, there were 5-6 bookstores in Levin. In due course, McLeod's became part of the Paper Plus group and remains that today. For a locally owned small business, membership of the larger group had obvious advantages in being able to access marketing support and in the area of purchasing of stock and the like. Bernie is a familiar figure around Levin, both in and outside of the shop, taking an active interest in what is going on in the community. He is a Justice of the Peace, a Rotarian and been involved in various community organisations over the years.

He loves living here, the most attractive drawcards being the lifestyle and convenience Levin offers, as well as being a great place to bring up children. Although a relatively small town, Levin is conveniently situated being a manageable distance from Palmerston North and Wellington.

Bernie was first elected as a Councillor in 2016 and then Mayor in 2019 and has put his name forward for a second term as mayor in this year's elections. As he says, the job is a complex one and it takes a while to feel comfortable in the role. He feels much better equipped to deal with the issues which may arise for our district in the future.

He is excited about the prospects for our district. Not so long ago, Levin was regarded as something of a 'zombie' town, but this has changed and growth is happening rapidly, with the huge increases in house and land prices further south.
