TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME CHURCH LIFE SURVEY NZ

What is the Church Life Survey?

It is a nationwide survey of church attenders, run every 5 years in line with NZ Census years. Every church is invited to take part.

The 2023 survey is administered by the Christian Research Association of NZ, in partnership with Wilberforce Foundation and Auckland Church Network. These organisations want to strengthen & support the NZ Church by equipping leaders with quality research & data.

The survey questions were compiled by experienced church researchers & leaders from a range of denominations & movements.

Why participate in the Church Life Survey?

The Catholic Bishops of NZ have agreed to jointly participate this year, in the Church Life Survey NZ (CLS). The survey is available in multiple languages covering parishioners' experience and involvement in their local community.

Our parish has significantly changed since the COVID pandemic. The survey endeavours to provide an opportunity to find out the demographic profile of our parish. It also provides a great method for hearing all the voices in your church or parish. It will also provides the leaders in the parish a robust evidence base for making decisions. Furthermore, the survey provides a snapshot of the spiritual health of your church or parish.

How can I participate in the Church Life Survey?

Those who are aged 15 and above are greatly encourage to participate. The forms are available in English, Maori, Samoan, Tongan, Filipino, Cebuano, and Spanish.


