Dear brothers and sisters,

"Take care to guard against all greed, for though one may be rich, one's life does not consist of possessions." - Luke 12:15

Last Sunday, our Lord taught us how we, as members of His praying Church, are to ask for the Holy Spirit. This week, He teaches us to take care, that when we pray to Him, we are not driven by the greed in our hearts. It is the precise opposite of the Holy Spirit.

The human heart is fallen and sick. Half-dead, we are driven by the fear of complete death and so we cling to people and things of this world in an unconscious and vain attempt to avoid death.

We work to possess created things which also corrupt and die to assure our fearful souls that the more we possess, the merrier will life be. Greed is so desperate to preserve one's own life, always fearing loss of one's own life and the props of the life it clings to.

Vanity of vanities.

The Holy Spirit of the Father and the Son, on the other hand, is the Spirit of Life, the Spirit that conquers death, that raised Jesus from the death. The Holy Spirit is Eternal Life itself and it never loses.

The Holy Spirit is the eternal love of the Father and of the Son, proceeding from both eternally and never to be denied, but always given. The Holy Spirit is Gift in Person, Generous Gift, Endless Gift, Infinite Gift.

We ask for this Gift and we shall receive. We seek for this Gift, and we shall find, we knock for this Gift and the door will be opened for us. With this Gift in our hearts, we will never fear to give, not even our very lives.

This Gift is heaven on earth.
