Dear brothers and sisters,

Then Abraham said, 'If they will not listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded if someone should rise from the dead.'

(Luke 16:31)

Our Lord continues to teach us in a very strong manner about the dangers of accumulating wealth and being possessed by it. We see in today's parable how the rich man was so possessed by his immense wealth that he viewed the poor man Lazarus as an accursed man who is not worth helping at all.

The soul of the rich man in the parable has been so thoroughly corrupted by sin that he no longer possesses any shred of human decency. His depravity persists beyond the grave and into the netherworld. In the place of torment, his pride and lust for pleasure persists. This teaches us that there is no repentance after death.

By this parable, our Lord is calling us to repentance and ongoing conversion. We must

never be quick to judge ourselves as better than the rich man in the parable.

To take this parable and any other parable out of the greater story of the descending of the Son of God in our midst and his suffering, death and resurrection is to fall into the trap of selfish activism. We will end up helping the poor to look good in the eyes of others and to make ourselves feel better about ourselves.

The lesson of this parable is hidden in the last sentence quoted above. The sacred scriptures of Moses and the prophets already contain the story of the truly rich man, our Lord who made Himself the truly poor man. The Old Testament foreshadowed the sacrifice of the

Son of God in Abraham's obedience to God to sacrifice his own son Isaac.

Jesus is the Truly Rich Man. By His conception in the womb of His Mother Mary, has descended from heaven and had crossed the chasm that divided us from Him. On Good Friday, He became the poorest of man and descended in the netherworld to raise poor repentant sinners to Himself in heaven.

We desire more than just bread for each other, especially the poor. We desire eternal life for one another, for the poor to recline at the bosom of the Son of God at the heavenly

banquet. This is the Spirit with which we help others.

Our Lord Jesus, has already set that heavenly banquet here and now for us at the Holy Eucharist. In listening to Moses and the prophets, the New Testament and to receive the very flesh and blood, soul and divinity of the truly Rich Man we, the poor, repentant sinners, can already now receive the true wealth of Eternal Life.

Let us pray that we will never be blind to Him, our true wealth, truly present in the Holy

Eucharist.

PRAYERS AND REFLECTIONS

TWO WONDERFUL FEAST DAYS THIS WEEK

This week, we celebrate two wonderful feasts - the first is the feast of the Holy Archangels and the second is the feast of the Holy Guardian Angels.

Some of us may be wondering...what are angels?

The term *angel* (Hebrew, *mal'ak*; Greek, *angelos*) means messenger. According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, 'angels are pure spiritual creatures of God who have understanding and will. They have no bodies, cannot die, and are usually not visible. They live constantly in God's presence and convey God's will and God's protection to men' [328–333, 350–351].

According to St. Thomas Aquinas, angels have infused knowledge, meaning they are infused with a perfect knowledge of all created things, including human nature. We are not mysteries to the angels. They know far more about us than we do ourselves!

God created all of the angels completely good. At one point in time, God allowed the angels to freely decide to be either definitively for or against Him. The angels that chose to be definitively for God remain in His service and His presence. They serve God and do His will constantly. The angels that chose definitively against God are what we call demons. But even Lucifer (Satan), the angel who was created with the highest natural intelligence, was created good. He then chose to reject God, saying, 'I will not serve!' He decided, using his free will, to instead spend his God-given goodness, beauty, power, and intellect on himself rather than on the Lord.

Saint Michael, the most venerated Archangel, who is known to be God's warrior, leads God's armies against Satan and the forces of evil. The other two archangels named in scripture are Saints Gabriel and Raphael. Gabriel, the messenger, delivers divine revelations - the most joyful message of all being the incarnation of the Son of God. Raphael, the healer, is known for aiding Tobias in the book of Tobit. We can pray to the Archangels for their intercession and to St. Michael, especially for protection from evil.

The Lord loves us, and his desire for us is to one day experience the greatest joy of joining Him in Heaven. He has given us each a companion - 'a guardian angel' - that has been assigned to guard us. Our guardian angels help us avoid spiritual dangers, guiding us on the journey towards our Heavenly home. The Church teaches that 'From its beginning until death, human life is surrounded by their watchful care and intercession. Beside each believer stands an angel as protector and shepherd leading him to life.' [CCC 336]. While we may not be able to see fully the presence of these angels, we do get to see in different ways how they might intervene, protect us, provide for us, and intercede for us. They also console us and illuminate us.

A few parishioners have shared these experiences where their guardian angel helped them...

"I was once on a train headed into Wellington. I felt my guardian angel telling me to get up out of my seat and stand by the door. After several minutes, I decided to listen to this strong sense and gave up my comfortable seat. I stood in the doorway, holding onto a rail bar for stability. Only 3 minutes later, my train derailed and crashed onto the rocky gravel next to the lines. As the carriage swayed back and forth, ready to tip over, I watched as a huge hulk of iron burst through the floor and destroyed the seat I was originally in. Thank God for my guardian angel encouraging me to move, and thank God, no one suffered significant injuries!"

"Something I do that has never failed is whenever I am struggling to find a carpark in a busy parking lot, I always ask my guardian angel to help me find one. Within 30 seconds, I can always find an opening!"

Invite your guardian angel to help you each day. You may be surprised by the help you receive!

SUZANNE AUBERT SAYS... All our proceedings must be characterised by the principle of justice. Children are never too young, the aged are never too old to have it meted out to them; the good are never so perfect as to be insensible to its denial.

Reflection: What exactly do we mean by 'justice'? It must be much more than punishing wrongdoers. Joseph, the 'just man', was unwilling to expose Mary to public shame when he found she was pregnant. Why? Because he recognised a mystery here and was fearful lest he hinder God's plan. In practice for me, it means giving the other person the benefit of the doubt, if there is doubt. And even if there isn't, I must recognise the mystery of God's designs.

Prayer: Lord, teach me to act with justice in all my dealings with others.


