THE DEDICATION OF THE LATERAN BASILICA

Dear brothers and sisters,

"Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up." (John 2:19)

We celebrate today the Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome, the Cathedral or the ecclesiastical seat of the Bishop of Rome, the Pope. It is significant for the whole universal church to remember and celebrate the dedication of this church as our mother church due to the primacy of St. Peter and his diocese, the Diocese of Rome.

We do more than celebrate the physical building of that church. We also celebrate the very real Temple that Christ is and all of us who are united to His Body through the sacraments, especially the Holy Eucharist.

We recall this mystery at every Mass most vividly at the words of Eucharistic Prayer III when the priest prays, "Grant that we, who are nourished by the Body and Blood of your Son and filled with his Holy Spirit, may become one body, one spirit in Christ."

Let us remember then at this Mass the infinite dignity and honour it is to be a part of the very body of the Son of God. With no merit on our part, but with the free and utter gift of the Holy Spirit that flowed as blood and water from the pierced heart of the Crucified Priest, we are being washed clean and made worthy to be part of the Real Temple of the New Jerusalem.

Let us also remember with gratitude the physical building that is our church, in which God the Father gathers us as His children. Let us continue to work together in making sure that it reflects the dignity and holiness of the Body of the Crucified Priest who is the Real Temple to whom we are united along with countless saints in heaven and all the hosts of angels.

Let us also pray this day that we remember and celebrate our own bodies as temples of the Holy Spirit united to the very body, blood, soul and divinity of the Son of God.

We humbly pray each day that the Holy Trinity will give us the graces we need to become the holy and pure temples of His Divine Presence radiating HIs light and beauty and laying down our lives in self sacrificing love with the Crucified Priest to God the Father.


